ain is the body's way of saying something's wrong. But sometimes people don't listen to what their body is trying to tell them until it's too late. It can start with a bit of tingling or discomfort while walking. Left untreated, though, painful conditions like varicose veins and unusual swelling can lead to complications, including ulcers and, in extreme cases, even amputations.

"Some of our new patients don't come in until the pain is so unbearable they can hardly walk," says Dr. Walaya Methodius-Rayford, a vascular surgeon with Georgia Vascular Specialists (GVS). "Unfortunately, other patients try to self-diagnose and manage their symptoms independently to no avail."

A Holistic Approach

Not only did she help save my leg, she took time to help my family understand what my care entailed. I chose to continue treatment at GVS because she goes above and beyond."
