Telemedicine Helps Create Access for Future Care

elemedicine is here—and here to stay for Beebe Healthcare and its medical group.

Beebe Medical Group rapidly accelerated our program early during the COVID-19 pandemic because we saw a need: People were not seeking healthcare.

We wanted to provide access for residents practicing social and physical distancing at home during the pandemic, so Beebe Medical Group began offering telemedicine visits across all offices.

During the first week of April 2020, more than 1,000 visits were conducted across all of Beebe Medical Group. By August, we eclipsed 12,500 visits, and we're continuing to grow even as social and physical distancing restrictions have slightly loosened.

All of our offices remained open for in-person visits, but we wanted to provide an option for those who wished to see their provider virtually. A patient only needs access to a computer or smart device, an email address, and basic computer skills. Assistance and instructional help can be provided upon setup. Between Beebe's patient portal and this technology, all patient information remains confidential and protected through the system.

The investment in technology by Beebe was not just at the medical group level. Home Care Services also provides telehealth to monitor and connect



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with patients virtually either pre- or post-procedure.

Patients having face-to-face time with their provider is a key component of clinical care as well as the mental well-being of a patient. During a telemedicine visit, they will see the provider, have the opportunity to ask questions, and perform any tasks with regular household items so the provider can create an assessment and plan—just like an in-office visit.

What's most exciting is the future that telemedicine holds in Sussex County. Growing up here, I understand that our rural area presents issues for access to care. With the growth of Beebe's telemedicine program, we have already started to close that gap for those without the necessary transportation to seek medical care.

Thank you for giving us the privilege of caring for you. Even at home, we are here.
