The Skin Cancer Center is the only Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) certified dermatology clinic in Oklahoma offering radiation, and its convenient in-house pathology lab is the only full-service laboratory in an Oklahoma clinic, which delivers quick results and provides patients timely diagnoses and treatment of their cancers. Dr. Abbott is the only board certified and fellowship trained dermatopathologist in Oklahoma who also works with patients in the clinic.

Prevention and Education

A large part of the practice involves routine skin checks: identifying, evaluating, and treating all growths of the skin, including moles and cysts. The entire staff works together to educate patients on the importance of sunscreen use and sun avoidance.

At other practices, biopsies must be sent out to a pathologist, but our center has its own fully accredited dermatopathology lab, and I personally read all our slides. This allows us to correlate what is seen under the microscope with what is seen when examining our patients. Keeping this important work in-house helps us make the best treatment decisions.
