erri Pritchard had almost given up hope of ever being free of the neck pain that had plagued her for years. A neurosurgeon near her home in northern Alabama had performed a lateral mass screw fixation to fuse three cervical vertebrae. "He said the surgery was successful; I was supposed to be cured," says Pritchard (not her real name), a retired teacher.

Instead the pain was worse than before. "My surgeon just shrugged and sent me to a pain clinic that prescribed pills. That was unacceptable," she says. "I didn't want pills; I wanted my life back."

An internet search led her to James L. Chappuis, MD, and Spine Center Atlanta. Pritchard drove three hours for an appointment and was brought to tears by the level of care she encountered. "Dr. Chappuis really listened to me," she recalls.

"It was immediately obvious that those screws needed to come out," says Dr. Chappuis, a 28-year orthopedic spine surgeon who has devoted his career to caring for patients who have experienced failed spinal surgeries. (He is also an adjunct faculty researcher in biomechanics at Georgia Tech and the holder of 16 patents for spine surgery implants.) "I see patients like Terri every day, people who have been told there is nothing more to be done. It's my life's work to help patients other physicians have given up on."

treatments for failed spine surgery syndrome, degenerative spinal stenosis (widely diagnosed among aging Baby Boomers), pinched nerves, sciatica, facet disease, herniated and degenerative discs, and more. Patients from all over the country can "meet" with Dr. Chappuis and his staff via video consultation from the comfort of their own homes.
