effects," says Horn. "Once the cancer is killed, the condition is managed and monitored like any other chronic condition. We're seeing patients live longer, fuller lives."

But there's good news. With the new DigniCap[®] technology, a coolantbased system that freezes and protects hair follicles

during a chemotherapy session, patients are experiencing dramatically less hair loss. The cost of DigniCap[®] is comparable to the cost of a wig, and financial resources at NCS are available to help patients with affordability.

The Theranostics Leader

Theranostics is a revolutionary treatment that uses imaging technology to pair specific drug treatments with specific tumor types. Rather than aiming to shrink the tumor by targeting both healthy and diseased cells, as in traditional chemotherapy, the goal of theranostics is to kill the tumor entirely—and precisely—to cease its spread.

"Most patients typically handle the treatment very well, with minimal side
