Trust Your Face to a Specialist

Dr. Jean-Paul Azzi, a double board-certified Facial Plastic & Reconstructive Surgeon, uses cutting-edge surgical techniques to reverse the effects of aging on patients' faces.

While training in New York City under renowned plastic surgeons, mentors noticed that Jean-Paul Azzi, M.D., was particularly skilled at a unique procedure known as a Deep-Plane Facelift. Seeing this, his mentors sent him down a path to embrace this expertise. Today, Dr. Azzi runs a thriving facial plastic and laser surgery practice with locations in Jupiter and Palm City, Florida, and is one of only a handful of plastic surgeons to specialize in Deep-Plane Facelifts.

Most plastic surgeons perform regular facelifts, says Dr. Azzi, which can leave visible scars and function merely as skin lifts that often droop in less than a year. These facelifts also require general anesthesia, which comes with risks like vomiting, coma, and even death.

Instead of just pulling the skin tight, “creating a windswept look,” says Dr. Azzi, Deep-Plane Facelifts go a level deeper. “I’m repairing the drooping, underlying facial structures—like muscles and tissues—and lifting those structures back to where they were 10 or 20 years ago,” he says. Another perk to Deep-Plane Facelifts is that they only require oral sedation and local anesthesia. The results speak for themselves, as there is very little discomfort, a quick recovery, and best of all, says Dr. Azzi, “the results last 10 times longer than normal facelifts.”

Natural, Specialized Results

Dr. Azzi specializes exclusively in cosmetic and reconstructive procedures of the face, nose, and neck, and is certified by the American Board of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. His expertise includes the highly complex field of revision procedures, particularly revision rhinoplasty and revision facelifts, attracting patients from across the country.

Another one of Dr. Azzi’s unique specialties is his popular Lip Lift procedure. Patients who have gotten lip fillers from other injectors often complain to Dr. Azzi about looking “duck-lipped” when too much volume is added to their upper lips.

“Most people’s issue is not actually volume loss; it’s gravity,” he notes. “Over time, the distance from the bottom of the nose to the pink part of the lip actually lengthens.”

To combat this issue, Dr. Azzi makes a small incision in the natural crease beneath a patient’s nose, then he suspends the muscles underneath and lifts the lip back up to a more youthful position. The upper lip rolls out slightly for a naturally fuller look. Similar to Deep-Plane Facelifts, a Lip Lift is a short surgical procedure performed with only local anesthesia and little downtime.

“Patients look more natural afterwards, and it’s essentially permanent,” says Dr. Azzi. Many patients opt to combine procedures, like getting a Lip Lift and a Deep-Plane Facelift at the same time.



In addition to elective procedures, Dr. Azzi is committed to giving back, both by performing reconstructive surgeries for skin cancer patients and by repairing childrens’ facial deformities in underprivileged countries. He developed many of his techniques throughout his humanitarian efforts.

Even after performing dozens of surgeries each week and thousands over the course of his career, it still doesn’t feel like work. He concludes, “It’s enjoyable to help people using my natural talents.”
