"I frequently saw patients visiting from long-term care facilities. They suffered from severe diseases but couldn't communicate with me about their conditions. And it was extremely difficult for them to travel for treatment," says Dr. Knoll. "I knew I could help."

With one medical assistant and an ultrasound machine, Dr. Knoll started visiting local nursing homes to provide on-site consultations and diagnostics for underserved patients. "That experience drew me to develop a good clinical practice that complements the unique needs of nursing homes and adult home-assisted living," he says.

Mobile, Communicative, Caring

Now with eight outpatient surgical centers across New York and New Jersey, and on-site service at over 100 long-term care settings in the area, Mobile Vascular Physicians provides full-service vascular care and unrivaled service.

"We work directly with our patients' primary care providers," Dr. Knoll says. "Once their physician raises a concern, we take it from there. We create a clinic-like environment for patients on-site and provide all the diagnostics needed to evaluate, manage, and treat conditions," including peripheral arterial disease, venous insufficiency, and more.

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"Our evaluation involves a physical exam and discussion—and not just with the patients themselves," he says. "Because some long-term care patients can't communicate their signs and symptoms, depending on their level of cognition, we prioritize constant communication with doctors, caregivers, and families."
