OVER 45? GET SCREENED FOR COLORECTAL CANCER

Brown Surgical Associates' Division of Colorectal Surgery offers multidisciplinary expertise in the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of diseases of the anus, colon, and rectum - like colorectal cancer.

BSA surgeons are skilled at treating patients with colorectal cancer which, when caught early, is very treatable. Screenings, such as a colonoscopy, can help find cancer before it advances and, in some cases, can prevent it altogether.

Several organizations and government panels have recently reduced the recommended screening age from 50 to 45 for those at average risk for the disease.

With the Same Surgeon, Mom and Daughter Survive Breast Cancer

A woman and her daughter say their lives were saved by the same doctor, years apart.

It was 20 years ago that Lucia Cornwell was first diagnosed with breast cancer. Center for Breast Health's Dr. Theresa Graves performed a lumpectomy, and Cornwell underwent chemo. When Cornwell's daughter was diagnosed with breast cancer 14 years later, there was no question they'd go to Dr. Graves for treatment.

While their doctor was the same, their experience was quite different. In the 14 years separating the pair's diagnosis, Brown Surgical Associates' Center for Breast Care implemented multidisciplinary clinics, which are teams of radiologists, pathologists, medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, plastic

The Cornwells described it as one-stop shopping.

Surgical Oncology

Brown Surgical Associates surgical oncologists specialize in breast cancer, gastric cancer, melanoma, sarcoma, pancreatic cancers, colorectal cancers, hepatobiliary cancers, and endocrine tumors.

This high level of focused expertise allows for the use of specialized techniques that are appropriate for cancer patients, including hyperthermic intraperitoneal chemoperfusion (HIPEC), an increasingly popular cancer treatment in which chemo is delivered directly to cancer cells that have advanced into the abdominal peritoneal cavity (peritoneal carcinomatosis).

DON'T IGNORE CAROTID DISEASE



Even as a spotlight remains on COVID-19, every 40 seconds someone in the US suffers a stroke which can lead to debilitation or death. However,

fears about the pandemic have kept many patients from seeking the life-saving medical attention they need to treat a major cause of stroke – carotid disease.

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For Kids, Obesity is a Side Effect of the Pandemic



While children haven't been among the hardest hit, the ongoing pandemic has had a definite impact on their health.

Brown Surgical Associates pediatric surgeon Dr. Elizabeth Renaud says she's seen a dramatic increase in the number of patients who are overweight or obese. Not only has she seen more teens referred to BSA's adolescent bariatric program, but she's also seen more younger patients presenting with conditions typically associated with adults - like gall stones.

Renaud says increased stress and reduced activity are likely causes. While surgery is an option for some teens, most are able to lose weight with lifestyle changes. She says parents can help reverse the weight gain by first keeping healthy food in the house.

BSA pediatric surgeon Dr. Joshua Honeyman says parents should also try to find ways to get their children moving again, whether that be in sports or other activities.

Obesity is a progressive and life-threatening condition marked by excess body fat, which can significantly reduce life expectancy. Health problems associated with obesity include but are not limited to diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease, and sleep apnea.
